On behalf of the 2.2 million members of AMAC – Association of Mature American Citizens, including over 7,636 residing in the state of Alaska, I write to offer our support for S. 2991, the *Veteran Overmedication and Suicide Prevention Act of 2019*.

As an organization comprised of many veterans of America's armed forces, AMAC is vested in ensuring that our nation's heroes are able to take advantage of all the benefits they have rightfully earned as a result of their service to our country. These brave patriots who have sacrificed so much for our freedoms, deserve all the assistance we can provide for them once their duty has been fulfilled.

S. 2991 directs the Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA) to conduct an independent study to determine if there is a direct correlation between overprescribing of medication and veteran suicide. Your bill would give our nation's servicemembers more access to essential mental health professionals and help reduce the epidemic of veteran suicide.
